## Complaint: Cheng Hui from Zhongnan University of Economics and Law (Prospective Exchange Student to France) Involved in Serious Legal Violations and Safety Risks

To: The Chinese-French Exchange Program Office / International Relations Office at your esteemed institution

Dear Sir or Madam,

As a concerned member of the public who values campus safety and animal welfare, I hereby formally report serious legal and ethical misconduct by a Chinese student, Cheng Hui (male, from Hubei Province), a member of Class 2203 in the International Business program at Zhongnan University of Economics and Law, who is currently listed as a participant in your upcoming Sino-French exchange program.

### 1. Summary of the Incident

Between July 11 and July 18, 2025, Cheng Hui repeatedly used an illegally purchased crossbow (capable of firing steel fishing harpoons) on the university campus to attack stray cats, causing severe harm:



A campus cat named "Tangyuan" was shot in the head by a 16cm steel harpoon, which penetrated from the top of the skull down to the neck, leaving the animal in critical

condition.

Another cat named “Yili” was shot through the left eye, resulting in permanent blindness.

Several other cats remain in a state of prolonged trauma due to the incident.

This conduct constitutes a serious violation of public ethics and animal protection principles, and more importantly, it violates Chinese law.

## **2. Police Findings and Penalty**

The Public Security Bureau of Wuhan East Lake High-Tech Development Zone has concluded that Cheng Hui’s actions constitute “picking quarrels and provoking trouble” and “illegal possession of prohibited weapons.”

In accordance with the Law of the People’s Republic of China on Penalties for Administration of Public Security, he was administratively detained for ten days, and the crossbow and arrows used were confiscated. This represents a formal legal punishment, and the relevant documentation is available for verification.

## **3. Current Status and Potential Risks**

Despite the confirmed facts and legal penalties, Zhongnan University of Economics and Law has not yet issued any public disciplinary action against Cheng Hui. Based on current information, he remains on the list of students scheduled to study in France under the joint program with your institution, with departure expected in September 2025.

Allowing this student to enter your campus without any prior disciplinary education, psychological assessment, or risk intervention may present the following risks:

Campus safety risks — His actions demonstrate a disturbing level of cruelty and violent tendencies.

Reputational risks — As a representative of a Chinese partner institution and of Chinese students abroad, his behavior, if exposed by international media, may severely damage the reputation of your university and the joint program.

Compliance risks — Under EU legal frameworks, campus violence and animal abuse could trigger stricter legal consequences.

#### **4. Our Request for Due Diligence**

In light of the above, we respectfully request that your institution exercise due diligence before officially admitting or hosting Cheng Hui:

Request a complete disciplinary record and psychological evaluation from the Chinese partner university;

Conduct an independent safety risk assessment to determine whether he is suitable for international academic exchange;

If adequate safeguards cannot be ensured, consider suspending or revoking his exchange eligibility in order to protect campus safety and program integrity.

#### **5. Supporting Documents**

Attached to this letter are detailed materials and photographic evidence, including:

The official penalty decision from the police,

A timeline of the incident,

Medical reports and images of the injured animals.

We fully understand and respect the value of international academic exchange. However, we firmly believe that true cooperation must be grounded in moral integrity and safety assurance. Your institution's attention and handling of this matter will not only protect students and staff but also reflect your university's commitment and responsibility in global educational partnerships.
